Pastor Kevin Metsinger





Introduction

One of the most dangerous words in the Christian life is that of Balance. To many this word smacks of compromise. To others it seems to be this always unobtainable goal. But balance is important, obtainable, and a worthy goal for every believer and family! Balance requires that we:

I. _____ A Relationship (v. 38).

- A. Jesus entered the city and Martha received Him into her house.
 - 1. This is the definition of relationship.
 - ⇒ The Savior / Believer Relationship
 - ⇒ The Husband / Wife Relationship (Gen. 24:67)
 - 2. An "individual" does not need balance because they only do as they please!
- B. Jesus warns us that choices must be made when entering a relationship with Him (Luke 14:25-33). Decisions that affect:
 - 1. Your Priorities (v. 26)
 - 2. Your Perseverance (vs. 27-30)
 - 3. Your Plan of Attack (vs. 31-33)

		1.	Pastor to Groom, will you have to be your wedded wife, to live together after God's ordinance in the holy estate of matrimony; will you love her, comfort her, honor, and keep her, in sickness and in health, and forsaking all others, keep yourself only unto her, so long as you both shall live?
		2.	Pastor to Bride, will you have to be your wedded husband to live together after God's ordinance in the holy estate of matrimony; will you submit to him, serve him, love, honor, and keep him, in sickness and in health, and, forsaking all others, keep yourself only unto him, so long as you both shall live?

 - ⇒ Ended up leading to greater blessings and fruitfulness (Mark 14:3-9).
- B. How should you Eliminate Hinderances?
 - 1. Don't Compromise! Compromising means both sides lose!
 - 2. Make Choices!
 - ⇒ We chose Church Camp and VBS over Baseball.
 - ⇒ We chose Home Schooling over Football and played Soccer instead.
 - ⇒ We choose to make Sunday dinner instead of eating out.
 - ⇒ I had to choose what hobbies to pursue.

John Paul Getty was one of the richest men in the world when he died. Shortly before that he said that he would trade half of his fortune for one true friend. Work is important. Making a living is vital. But remember that God has promised to meet your needs (Mt 6:25-34). At the end of the day a balanced life means you need to do without some things. Make sure you value what is truly important and experience the blessings too few enjoy!

Seeing God's Way (Part I)

The Symptoms of Giving Ground to Satan

Introduction

- Eph. 4:17 This I say therefore, and testify in the Lord, that ye henceforth walk not as other Gentiles walk, in the vanity of their mind.
- The book of Ephesians exhorts the readers to walk a certain way several times. In this text God tells them (and us) to "walk not" specifically "as other Gentiles walk." They were saved, but they had (as we do) the awful possibility of walking like Gentiles (unsaved) walk. If they did, there were some stunning consequences and there was something desperately wrong. Many times this comes from giving Satan ground.
- Symptom: Worthlessness Do you struggle at times with feeling like you are worthless?

I. Access to Life is Separated

- Eph. 4:18 ". . . being alienated from the life of God through the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart:"
- A. Through Ignorance
- B. Through Blindness
 - How? Occurs through Rejection of Truth
- Illustration: The same sun that melts the wax, hardens the clay! What is your heart made of?!

⇒ Symptoms:

- ☑ Insecurity Do you struggle thinking about what other people think about you? Do you wonder about how you fit in to your world? Do you deal with fears in your life?
- ☑ Struggle with Trusting Do you struggle with trusting other people? God?
- ☑ Addictive Video Games Do you spend times playing video games that should be used in more profitable way? Are you up past midnight playing video games?
- ☑ Excessive Social Media Do you spend too much time on social media? Do you think about it at times you are not on it?
- ☑ Overeating Do you eat more than you should to make you feel better?
- ☑ Excessive and/or Inappropriate Media Do you see things via media that are inappropriate? Do you watch media when there are more pressing things to do?
- ☑ Drug/Alcohol Addictions Do you turn to prescription drugs, alcohol, or illegal drugs to cope with life?

II. Ability to Reason is Darkened

- Eph. 4:18 "Having the understanding darkened,"
- A. What? Understanding is our Ability to Reason



B. How? Understanding is Darkened by An Outside Agent

- 1. Occurs through Rejection of Light
 - Illustration: A step toward the opening of a cave brings more light, less darkness. A step away from the opening brings more darkness and less light.
- 2. Occurs through Deception of Satan

⇒ Symptoms:

- ☑ Performance Acceptance Do you feel like you must "perform" before people will accept you?
- ☑ Unwise in Decisions Do you purchase thing you really don't need and the purchase puts financial pressure on you?
- ☑ Tendency to Tangents Do you go on theological or political tangents? Are you known for conspiracy theories? Do you lean toward being dogmatic over theological minutiae?
- ☑ Unfulfilled in Life Do you have an underlying lack of fulfillment out of life?
- ☑ Disobedient in the Home Are you consistently disobedient to clear commands in regard to responsibilities in the home (Husbands, love; wives, reverence)?
- ☑ Lack of submission Do you struggle with a lack of submission toward God-given authorities in your life? Do you reject leadership after a perceived or real failure in their lives or leadership?
- ☑ Run from Problems Do you run away from tension, problems, relationship deterioration? Do you have a track record of leaving instead of resolving?



III. Addiction to Filth is Realized

- Eph. 4:19 "Who being past feeling have given themselves over unto lasciviousness, to work all uncleanness with greediness."
- ⇒ How? Occurs through Rejection of Conviction
- ⇒ Symptoms:
 - ☑ Sexual Sin: Pornography, Fornication, Adultery Have you engaged in sexual sin? Do you look at pornography, sensual images or videos? Have you lost "control"?
 - ☑ Erotized Wound Does your wound find expression in an area of moral failure?
 - ☑ Live with Shame Do you feel like something is wrong with you? Is there something you have done or was done to you that causes you to feel like you are "defective"?
 - ☑ Destroy Your Soul Do others notice that you are detached? You have a hard time connecting with others?

Conclusion

- This is the way the lost live, but the saved can end up like them. That is why there is this exhortation not to walk this way.
- God clearly does not want to live this way which means there is a way out!

Seeing God's Way (Part II)

The Way of Giving Satan Ground

Introduction

- Why do many Christians find themselves walking in the vanity of their mind. The answers are found in Ephesians 4:25-31. The one that screams at us today is found in Ephesians 4:26-27. We give ground to Satan. It is from that ground that he constantly attacks and defeats us. This is often first manifested in the home and primarily in marriage. We cannot take the ground back until we know how he got the ground.
- Eph. 4:26-27 Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: Neither give place to the devil.

I. We are Provoked – "Be ye angry"

- Eph. 4:26 "Be ye angry"
- A. Father Wounds
- 8 Quote: "The vast majority of men I have counseled who struggle with sexual issues have father wounds in their souls." Ted Roberts
- Proverbs 7:25-27 Let not thine heart decline to her ways, go not astray in her paths. For she hath cast down many **wounded**: yea, many strong men have been slain by her. Her house is the way to hell, going down to the chambers of death.

Seeing God's Way (Part 2)

1. Angry Father

- Eph. 6:4 And ye father, provoke not your children to wrath:
- ☑ Problem: He says things that often define a child's view of himself. The unpredictability of his anger may cause the child to have trauma and develop anxiety. Often the child becomes angry as well.

2. Absent Father

- Exodus 22:22 Ye shall not afflict any widow, or fatherless child.
- Psalm 68:5 A father of the fatherless, and a judge of the widows, is God in his holy habitation.
- ☑ Problem: He has left and often reinforces the rejection by his words and actions.

3. Passive Father

- I Thessalonians 2:11 As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father doth his children,
- ☑ Problem: He is there and he provides, but he is not involved in a parent/child relationship

4. Permissive Father

- I Samuel 3:13 For I have told him that I will judge his house for ever for the iniquity which he knoweth; because his sons made themselves vile, and he restrained them not.
- ✓ Problem: May be a good father, but he does not love enough to say, "No."

5. Demanding Father

- Ephesians 6:4 And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.
- ☑ Problem: He gives no affirmation, but has perfectionistic expectations which result in criticism of any failure.

B. Mother Wounds

1. Absence of Nurture

- ☐ I Thessalonians 2:7-8 But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherisheth her children: So being affectionately desirous of you, we were willing to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also our own souls, because ye were dear unto us.
- ☑ Problem: She does not have a nurturing spirit toward her children. They do not feel cherished and nurtured.

Absence of Time

- Proverbs 29:15 The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame.
- ☑ Problem: She does not spend time with her children. This could be for a variety of reasons. It could be selfish, but it could be because she is attempting to survive after a divorce.

3. Absence of Safety

- Matthew 23:37 O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!
- ☑ Problem: Because of her selfishness she puts her children in precarious situations.

4. Absence of Submission

- Ephesians 5:22-24 Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the saviour of the body. Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in every thing.
- ☑ Problem: She lacks a submissive attitude toward her husband and the father of her children.
