Pastor Don Veazey





Fusing the Fractures

Healing the Hurts of a Blended Home

In *Genesis 21* we read the story of Isaac's birth and the struggle that followed. In verse 8, Isaac is around 3 years old and his 17-year old stepbrother, Ishmael, is a bully. Sarah insists that Ishmael and his mother be cast out of the home, and Abraham has no choice.

Conflict is inherent with all relationships, and growing through those conflicts helps to strengthen and solidify our bond as families. However, blended families have the added caveat of coming from brokenness. Every fused family is a joining of previously fractured families.

 There are five core causes of strife in the blended family. These root problems manifest themselves in a variety of ways, but they can be categorized into the following:

1. Big Expectations

We come to marriage with a set of ideas and expectations that are often unrealistic and unattainable. Maybe you think "things will be different this time" or we will be one "big happy family" or that your new partner will instantly love your children, and their kids will instantly accept and love you. In reality, no matter how badly we want it, a blended family will never function like a first family. The sooner we understand and accept this, the better chance we have at building a successful and thriving marriage.

* E. Mavis Heatherington, in For Better or For Worse, Divorce Reconsidered wrote, "It takes couples five to seven years to get through the tensions of step-family life, to the point where their stress level declines to match that of a husband and wife in a first marriage."

2. Broken Trust

Trust is important in any relationship, and broken trust can destroy a family quicker than anything else. Every member of the family is affected by broken trust, whether they realize it or not. A child can have their trust broken by a mother who loves a man other than their daddy. A mother can have their trust broken by a daughter who goes to the mall with a new step-mother. A chance meeting with an ex-husband can be fodder for jealousy and suspicion. We struggle trying to decide who should come first and where our trust belongs.

3. Baggage

No matter the circumstances, we all bring baggage into marriage. When entering a second marriage the baggage may need its own U-haul. Favorite songs, special restaurants, sacred memories...we can't simply put it all into a closet and forget it's there. A second marriage is still 2 becoming 1, not 4 becoming 2.

4. Boundaries

Setting clear boundaries in a blended family is one of the most important things you can do to protect your marriage and establish safety within your home. Boundaries keep the good things in and the bad things out. Our families are like puzzles, and each piece has a place. Blended families are made up of pieces from multiple puzzles, but they can still work, if you'll establish and respect clear boundaries.

5. Blending

Blending families is a continual process, and the final result often isn't visible until many years after the wedding. Just as in a poorly-mixed can of paint, family members may remain as "chunks," unwilling to give in to their new family role. Children may refuse to respect their stepparent, who is "not my dad." A new spouse may be unwilling to combine bank accounts, bracing for the possibility of another failed marriage. Whatever the scenario, a refusal to blend in a fused family is a guarantee for disaster.

- Ron Deal, author of "The Smart Stepfamily" presents seven steps you can take to ensure the family you have today is healthy and honors God.
- **1.** <u>Step Up</u> Establish a relationship with God. Salvation should be the primary concern in any relationship. *Amos 3:3 2 Corinthians 6:14*
- 2. <u>Step Down</u> Adjust your expectations and learn how to "cook" a stepfamily. We are an instant society, and want a great family NOW! Instead of a microwave meal, consider your family crock pot creation. It's going to take time, but it will be worth the wait! *James 1:2-4*
- **3.** <u>Two-Step</u> Make your marriage the priority in your home. Just as partners in a dance must respect and rely on each other, husbands and wives must coordinate their moves together. *Ephesians 5:21-33*

- **4.** <u>Step In Line</u> Establish and maintain specific parenting roles. Determine to love and care for all of the children in the relationship, and not just those who came with you to the marriage. *Ephesians 6:1-4*
- 5. <u>Side-Step</u> Learn to face and deal with these common pitfalls: unrecognized loss and unexpressed grief; menacing emotions and knee-jerk reactions; the combination of special holiday and family traditions. *Romans* 8:18
- 6. <u>Step Through</u> Learn to overcome the special challenges facing your blended family.

 As difficult as they may be, remember that you're not alone in this struggle! *James 1:5-7 Luke 1:37*
- 7. <u>Step Over</u> Enter into the promised land of family love. Regardless of your broken trust, baggage or big expectations, God has a plan for your marriage and family. *Jeremiah 29:11*

Don't accept that your step-family is a shameful secret or a lesser priority in God's economy. Just as God continued to reveal His plan for Hagar and her son Ishmael in *Genesis 21*, God hears and has a plan for each of us. Allowing Him to reveal that plan, and committing to follow it, will make your family a place of blessing and love for all who get to witness it.

Strengthening a Ministry and Marriage

Text -2 Corinthians 4:1-18

Introduction: I'm going to assume that when you surrendered to serve God in full-time ministry, your end goal was to hear, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:21). May I say this is a good and attainable goal that many times can be forgotten amid life and ministry. If you have been in ministry any length of time you know it can take its toll on you spiritually, emotionally, and physically. In fact, balance is something discussed among preachers often. The work of the ministry requires a lot of time, effort, and attention and consequently our personal and family life can suffer.

Please note with me a phrase Paul uses twice in chapter 4, verses 1 & 16, "We faint not." Paul lived a consistent life. He didn't quit amid ministry difficulty, and we can read of his troubles in 2 Corinthians 11:23-33. Ministry done right is hard work, and you will absolutely have a target on your back and your home. In this chapter Paul is addressing what kept him going in the midst of difficulty and trial. Paul found joy and purpose in serving God in good times and bad.
